Without telling the correct answer ask the students which student should	(8 min)	
receive the prize.		
 Let them attempt to explain who the winner of the game should be and why. 		
Eventually tell the class the correct number of jelly beans. After excitement		
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dies down, attempt to give the prize to the person who was the furthest from the right answer. Protest will ensue.		
 Let the real winner try to explain why she should get the prize, rather than the person whose guess was the furthest away. 		
 Explanation: The analogy can now be clearly drawn that there is one and only one truth in the world - objective truth. Your subjective opinion about who should win the jar, does not change the objective truth about the rule we decided to use to choose the winner. Objective truth is a reality that we cannot change or decide for ourselves." Okay, we just talked about objective truth and subjective opinion. There is a subjective opinion out there that some people seem to believe. They think that there is no God who loves us. The objective truth is that there is such a God, but like theologians we have to look much further into the evidence to see that truth. Some people are of the opinion that they should be free to do whatever they want. However, morality is not something that is subjective. God created us with the freedom to choose between good and evil, not to determine what they are. We must understand the truth of our freedom and then use it responsibility
