TOB Tuesday: Theology of the Body, Part 1

"In his Theology of the Body, Saint John Paul II seeks to establish an adequate anthropology in which the human person, in both his spiritual and physical dimensions, reveals truths about God. George Weigel has called it, "one of the boldest reconfigurations of Catholic theology in centuries." Part 1 examines the philosophical developments that preceded it. Major schools of thought have been greatly oversimplified in order to show how St. John Paul II's contribution is necessary, transformative, and faithful.

Augustinianism

Prior to the thirteenth century, the dominant school of thought in Catholic theology was that of St. Augustine. Early in the fifth century, Augustine refuted the heresy of Pelagianism. Pelagius taught that Adam's original sin did not taint human nature. For that reason, Christ's sacrifice on the cross was neither necessary nor redemptive. A neo-Platonist, Augustine uses the philosophy of Plato, together with the deposit of faith, to oppose Pelagianism and create a new way of looking at everything.

The resulting synthesis, Augustinianism, is objective. It acknowledges truth, including moral truth, as outside of us, not a matter of personal opinion, therefore, universal, not particular to individuals, cultures, or circumstances. According to Augustine, we can know truth through Revelation, right reason, and the Church.

Augustine's theology is also deductive. Deductive reasoning begins with a general idea and ends with a specific one. Father Richard Hogan describes this approach (later used by scholastics, especially Thomas Aquinas):

One started with a "given" which was accepted, e.g., God is a pure spirit, and added what was called the minor term, e.g., a pure spirit does not have a body... (then) drew a conclusion, e.g., God does not have a body.

Finally, Augustinian theology is principled. Principles flow from objective truth and deductive reasoning. The opposite of principled is experimental.

Immaculate Conception and Theology of the Body

Volumes could be written about the connection between this feast and the "great mystery" unfolded in John Paul II's Theology of the Body (TOB). For starters, it's no mere coincidence that John Paul II began writing his TOB on this marvelous feast day — the handwritten date on page one of his original manuscript says December 8, 1974. And above that he wrote this dedication: Tota Pulchra es Maria — "You are all beautiful, Mary" — a clear adaptation of the bridegroom's words in the Song of Songs, "You are all beautiful, my love, there is no blemish in you" (Song 4:7). It's a long held tradition of the Church to recognize Mary as the "unblemished" bride spoken of in the Song of Songs. As the perfect model of the Church, Mary represents the mystical bride for whom Christ "gave himself up ... that he might sanctify her" that she might be "without spot or wrinkle ... holy and without blemish" (Eph 5:25-27).

Of course, it may seem odd to speak of Mary in some way representing Christ's "bride." Bishop Fulton Sheen explained it this way: "Now we've always thought, and rightly so, of Christ the Son on the cross and the mother beneath him. But that's not the complete picture. That's not the deep understanding. Who is our Lord on the cross? He's the new Adam. Where's the new Eve? At the foot of the cross. … And so the bridegroom looks down at the bride. He looks at his beloved. Christ looks at his Church. There is here the birth of the Church" (Through the Year with Bishop Fulton Sheen, Ignatius Press 2003).


New Pro-Life Programs Launched for Catholic High School Students

Two new pro-life educational programs were recently launched geared towards helping Catholic high school students understand Church teaching on the dignity of human life and the need to be actively involved in defending life.

The Catholic pro-life organization American Life League <u>released</u> a new program entitled "Who Was the Real Margaret Sanger?: A Look at the Woman Who Made Birth Control Popular in America." And Students for Life of America (SFL) <u>teamed up</u> with Healing the Culture to bring their "Philosophical Foundations" resource specifically to Catholic high schools through SFL's new "Faith Foundations" program. Zero K

As with earlier works, the novelist asks if there is really anything worth living for, given the state of the world

At the end of Stanley Kubrick's 2001: A Space Odyssey, astronaut Dave Bowman is reborn as a star child. As man has evolved over the centuries, Kubrick suggests, attaining more advanced states of being, this is the highest, closest to God. It's a haunting image: a luminescent foetus in a glowing spherical sac, floating above the earth. Like an angel. A "superman". In Don DeLillo's Zero K, there is a similar vision of sublimity. A woman suspended in a casing, a body "lit from within". "It was a beautiful sight. It was the human body as a model of creation." And in a sense, the woman is also waiting to be reborn sometime in the unknowable future. In perfect, untainted, evolved form.

DeLillo's novel centres around the theology of the body. Its corporeal form—in a way, this is his most guttural book, the most raw one, because we are inundated with bodily images, from the real to the unreal (the white, featureless mannequins littering its pages)—and its spiritualities relating to time and humanity.

The long first section of the book is set in a certain remote nowhereness. A barren landscape, which the narrator, Jeffrey Lockhart, fails to geographically contextualize. He has travelled a "marathon journey" by aeroplane, and been driven into seemingly unmapped territory to arrive at a compound of low geometric structures, bleached as the landscape. He describes them as "buildings in hiding, agoraphobically sealed", blind buildings, "designed to fold into themselves...when the movie reaches the point of digital collapse". It's

through this air of strangeness, and distance, that we enter the novel. As though narrator, and reader, are trapped in a movie set, everything imbued by the unreal.

What a good idea!



Understanding fertility is key to good marriage

SURREY, B.C. – For Dominic and Lisa Price natural family planning is exactly that —natural.

Few couples are as enthusiastic about using NFP as the Trinidadian couple, who moved to Canada in 2012. They have appeared on TV and taught hundreds of couples how to use the Billings Method to achieve or avoid pregnancy.

"If you look at the cycle and you look at God's design, He created women with naturally occurring cycles of fertility and infertility," Lisa said.

She calls these "naturally occurring phases" that women are generally not taught to watch for.

"Contraception has been promoted as a fix-all. When you get into the complications of using it, the side effects of using it, there's a heavy price you pay," she said.

Natural Family Planning is not only a valuable tool for married couples, but all women can use it to monitor their health. Lisa believes Billings, one of three major methods of NFP, is better for women's health and for a marriage relationship than contraception.

"There are no drugs. There are no devices" or side effects, Lisa said. "You already have something that works."
