

GENERAL AUDIENCE OF 26 SEPTEMBER 1979

Despite the bad weather and a slight drizzle of rain more than 20,000 people attended the General Audience in St Peter's Square on 26 September. The following is the text of the Pope's address.

"When Christ referred to the "beginning," he asked his questioners to go beyond, in a certain sense, the boundary which in Genesis passes between the state of original innocence and that of sinfulness, which started with the original fall....."

Boundary Between Original Innocence And Redemption

Pope John Paul II

Summary of the Fourth Audience by Tom Kennedy

According to the Pope, when talking about the "beginning", Christ drew a boundary between the state of original innocence, and the state of sinfulness that started with the fall, and told his listeners to go beyond that boundary. The limits of these two directly opposite states, which influence the inner person in every way, were set by this boundary. By referring to the "beginning" Christ points to the continuity of the two different states or dimensions of man. The boundary did not stop with the fall, it continues today and throughout history.

When man fell, he broke the original covenant between the Creator and the created (man). Sin is what the Pope calls "part of historical man" that we read about with the Pharisees who questioned Jesus, as well as all those questioners in all history including modern man.

The Pope believes that it is impossible to understand historical sinfulness without understanding the state of original innocence, which is fundamental to man. This original innocence is the dimension of man being created in the image of God. If sin is the loss of grace, then that grace was the grace of original innocence. We were created in grace (innocence), were meant to live in grace (innocence), but when man fell we lost that grace (innocence).

This doesn't mean that original innocence has been lost. In Genesis 3:15(1) we find the first reference to our salvation, the salvation of original innocence. "I shall put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; it will bruise your head and you will strike its heel." In this way, historical and modern man participate in original sinfulness as it is hereditary (we have all lost original grace) and, at the same time, we all add our own sins to our lives, and we also participate in salvation as we are eligible to receive it and help create it with God. Paul, in The Letter to The Romans, tells us "²³ And not only that: we too, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, even we are groaning inside ourselves, waiting with eagerness for our bodies to be set free. ²⁴ In hope, we already have salvation; in hope, not visibly present, or we should not be hoping -- nobody goes on hoping for something which is already visible."

Since we were created male and female, only the redemption of the body ensures the continuation and unity between sin and original innocence. It is this redemption on which the original covenant between God and His people rests.

It is through the theology of the human body that we can analyze what the "beginning" means, as referred to in Genesis, but we must also look at the relationship between revelation and experience. As we mainly see bodily man by experience, we can only experience it back to the fall. We cannot experience it into original innocence since our individual humanity is incapable of experiencing it as it really was. However, our human experience is a legitimate way to interpret the "beginning" as we will see later.

Pope John Paul II: 'Man cannot live without love'

Scripture-based, divine revelation of our humanity, described by God as being "very good," according to Genesis.

The Second Vatican Council document Gaudium et Spes, the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World, states in section 22 that Christ not only reveals the Father but "fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear."

In this, Christ not only gives us an "authentic anthropology" from Genesis, but reveals a "Spousal Love" that was "the mystery" hidden in the heart of the Father "before heaven and earth were created: that God always intended to create human beings, always intended to become human, always intended Spousal Love for humanity, and always intended that our heaven would be in the "heart of the Father," as one in Christ as He is one with the Father.

Therefore the (Logos) Son of the Father was sent not only to created heaven and earth, not only to reveal Himself as our "Yahweh-Creator," but also to reveal God's Spousal Love, as our "Adonai-husband."

Teaching Theology of the Body to Children

"I would suggest that teaching TOB to kids means presenting the Bible as the love story between God and his people that begins and ends in union with him. It means discussing the Catechism in a manner that conveys that it reveals the basics of our quest to understand the intimate heart of God and his loving plan for his people. It means discussing morality, not in terms of rules and punishments and lines we may tiptoe up to but never cross, but as a guide to what it means to be truly loving to ourselves and others. And it means presenting a model of love that is openly physically affectionate, ordered to meeting the unique needs of every family member, is extravagantly generous (and expects extravagant generosity in return), and is rooted in a life of both communal and individual prayer.

Anytime parents do these things, they are teaching TOB to their kids. TOB isn't supposed to be a subject we study. *If that's all it is, then it is useless even as an intellectual exercise*. As an "adequate anthropology" TOB was always intended to be a message we live; the internal structure that guides our thinking, relating, and decision making as we live the gospel of Jesus Christ and labor to build his Kingdom (aka the "Civilization of Love.")"

Philadelphia to host the 8th World Meeting of Families





How often do we find ourselves complaining about our home life, the boss, coworkers, the weather, etc.? Based on a daily homily given by Pope Francis on April 3 constant complaining prevents us from noticing Jesus' real presence among us. In our complaints we focus only on the darkness, and fail to see the goodness of our lives. In the same homily, Pope Francis said, we have a tendency to withdraw and complain when we encounter the Cross, but the Cross is the Lord's presence made truly visible. Like the Holy Father's personal style, one of simplicity, his daily homilies offer simple life lessons that are easily understood.
