

The word *apologetics* comes from the Greek word *apologia* found in **1 Peter 3:15** and means "defense." The Bible says that we're to always be ready (thus the name of this ministry) to give a "defense" (an *apologia*) to people who ask us about the hope we have as Christians.

	TOB is not merely a "theoretical system." As St. John Paul II, himself, wrote, "The theology of the body is not merely a theory, but rather a specific, evangelical, Christian [education in the meaning] of the body" (TOB 122:5). And that means the TOB is not only for married people.

Theology of the body is for *every*-body. It's an education in what it means to be human. It's an education in what it means that we are made in the image of God as male and female. It's an education in why we are here, what it means to love, and how to reach our ultimate destiny.

"I'm a nun.

Technically, I'm a religious Sister, because "nun" refers to cloistered contemplatives. But no matter. We answer to "nun," too, because it's in common parlance and rhymes with a lot of words... like "fun."

So, what's it like being married to Jesus? Real. Very real. It is not poetry. It is not metaphor. It is not make-believe. Do you think I would give up my life to play pretend princess? Not on your life. Mother Teresa once said: "If you are called, you will know it, and you won't be able to explain it to anyone." But fools rush in, so here goes...."

Francis affirms that "if we reflect on the proper relationship between human beings and the world around us, we see the need for a correct understanding of work; Underlying every form of work is a concept of the relationship which we can and must have with what is other than ourselves"" (125) David Cloutier

The Theological Heart of Laudato Si'

The overwhelming immediate importance of Laudato Si' is to call both church and world to respond to the "urgent challenge to protect our common home" (13). As Tony Annett has already ably pointed out, Francis is not mincing words here, even if he is careful. Above all, the encyclical suggests we are home-wreckers, yet we also have a chance for a deeper conversion from our "internal deserts," (217; one of the many quotes from Benedict XVI) to a more joyful and more challenging way of life: "Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start, despite their mental and social conditioning. We are able to take an honest look at ourselves, to acknowledge our deep dissatisfaction, and to embark on new paths to authentic freedom" (205). Such a response, the pope makes clear in chapters 1 & 5, requires international cooperation because of the nature of the problems. That Francis chose to highlight the atmosphere, water, and the diversity of species is telling – these are all problems where global cooperation is absolutely necessary. Your car, lawn, and hardwood flooring may very well be implicated, but "nevertheless, self-improvement on the part of individuals will not by itself remedy the extremely complex situation facing our world today" (219).

110111 Sept 20, 2014	I was struck this past June when I read the <u>Instrumentum Laboris</u> , or working document for the 3rd Extraordinary General Assembly of the <u>Synod of Bishops</u> , which will take place from Oct 5-19, 2014. The Synod, or meeting of Bishops, will focus on "pastoral challenges to the family in the context of evangelisation" which is why everyone refers to it as the "Synod on the Family". About 100 participants, including the presidents of

all Episcopal Conferences, will attend the extraordinary synod.

There actually will be two Synods: After the "extraordinary" or "preparatory" one this year, there will be an "Ordinary" General Assembly October 4-25, 2015. The goal of this year's Synod is to set the agenda for the big synod of 2015. The theme for next year's synod is "Jesus Christ reveals the mystery and vocation of the family". This second synod, will also include experts and above all else, families.




