'We are gift, so how should we act?' What I learned at a Theology of the Body course

I and other participants were fascinated by the profundity of John Paul's teaching

Until last week, I thought I had a good basic understanding of Theology of the Body, St John Paul II's teaching on human sexuality. But ten minutes into last week's London symposium, I realized I knew practically nothing. Studying the subject, you realize how deep it is – but you can also feel as though your head is about to explode.

Yet one of John Paul's central insights is a simple one: that the deepest desire of the human heart is to be loved. One speaker, Sr John Mary of the Sisters of Life, poignantly illustrated this with the story of a Catholic soldier killed in Afghanistan. The soldier was shot through the neck, just above his bulletproof vest; as he lay dying in the arms of his commanding officer, he uttered his last words: "Tell me I'm loved."

John Paul II's "Triptych" of the Human Person

This article focuses on the first part of Pope John Paul II's Theology of the Body which broadens the vision of humanity from not just this life (historical man), but to what God intended for man before the Fall (original man), as well as what God has in store for those who love Him (eschatological man).

We have good news! The rich teaching of John Paul II's Theology of the Body (TOB) is beginning to filter into seminaries, undergraduate theology courses,

and into specialized seminars. But despite this good news, many of today's priests, deacons, and religious likely were educated before the insights from the TOB were integrated into various seminary and monastic programs. Adding to this problem is that the TOB was originally delivered as a series of talks, with its style complicating and confounding what the late Pontiff was trying to communicate. This problem is unfortunate (but not insurmountable) because his Theology of the Body is essentially a series of reflections on scripture passages, many of which appear in the regular Sunday reading cycles. Given that most lay adults receive what precious little instruction they do through Sunday homilies, they may be missing out on some very profound counteract utilitarian views insights that of the person, misunderstandings of marriage, that so pervade contemporary society.

The Beauty of Marriage from a Biblical Perspective

We live in a society where the understanding of marriage has become all but lost amid various personal interpretations. There is therefore a need to have a deeper discussion in the family, so to speak—the Christian family. In the midst of widespread confusion regarding the definition of marriage, it's easy to lose sight of what we believe. We have been blessed with the truths revealed to us in God's Word. The Scriptures generally, and Jesus in particular, teach us truths about marriage that go beyond what we could ever figure out by human reason alone.

Marriage: A Dominant Scriptural Theme

The first thing we need to understand is that marriage is not a "side teaching" of the Bible; marriage is a *central theme* of God's Word, arguably *the* central theme. Marriage marks the beginning, middle, and end of the Bible. In the beginning, the account of creation climaxes with the creation of Eve, the Bride, in Genesis 2:18-22, followed by Adam's "wedding vows" in Gen 2:23, forming the first marriage ever and establishing the pattern of marriage for

the rest of human history (Gen 2:24).

Addiction to pornography, masturbation, lust, and other sexual sins can be so deeply rooted that they seem impossible to overcome. But one cardinal says that the Catholic Church offers a "vision of hope and freedom" to anyone struggling with sexual addiction.

"This is a struggle of our fallen human nature, and it is right from the very beginning of time – people have struggled with the issue of sexuality," said Cardinal Thomas Collins, Archbishop of Toronto, in an interview published May 2 on the Archdiocese's Youtube channel.

Are there only two sexes?

A generation ago, this might have seemed like a silly question. But given the rise of gender theory, transgenderism, intersexuality, and all of their related phenomena, the question now appears to be both complex and pressing. . .

What differentiates human males from human females? Is it the number of sex chromosomes? Is it the possession of the appropriate sex organs? Is it the amount of testosterone or estrogen? The difficulty is that none of these standards <u>always works</u>: some individuals are born with extra chromosomes, such as XXYY or XYY. Some individuals are born with both pairs of sex organs. Some females have higher testosterone levels than many men.

That, said Peter Colosi, assistant professor of moral theology at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, is one of the primary reasons why, in 2007, he coordinated the first International Theology of the Body Symposium in Europe.

"The theology of the body came from Europe, but Europeans don't know it, "Colosi said. "In America, many people have learned about it and seen their lives changed for the better. They've kicked pornography addictions, stopped

contracepting and discovered great happiness in living according to the Church's teachings on human sexuality. But that's not the case in Europe."

At the upcoming <u>USCCB Convocation of Catholic Leaders in Orlando</u>, my wife and co-author, Lisa Popcak, will be leading a panel titled, <u>The Family and Sexuality: Challenges and Opportunities</u>. One of the first questions the panel will address is, "What is often overlooked when attempting to evangelize people about the Catholic vision of sex and love especially in marriage and family life?"

Our response? The single most overlooked point in communicating the importance of the Church's view on sex in marriage is that sex stands at the center of the lay vocation. Attempting to practice a lay spirituality while ignoring sex is like living a zombie spirituality that divorces the body from the soul. 


