

The word

apologetics comes from the Greek word apologia found in 1 Peter 3:15 and means "defense." The Bible says that we're to always be ready (thus the name of this ministry) to give a "defense" (an apologia) to people who ask us about the hope we have as Christians.

"But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defence to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear;" 1 Peter 3:15 Confirmation. We taught the students in the classes to make virtue beads themselves by providing the material along with the instructions. This gave them more ownership in the beads, and hopefully more interest. We also talk a little about St. Theresa, how we inherited the beads through her. We showed them how to use the beads when they carry out a "little" act of virtue. These acts can include such actions as controlling their anger, sharing their toys, and respecting every person including those of the opposite gender. Practicing these virtues teaches them chastity and helps them live it through the reminder of the beads.

Chastity is learning how to love one another properly, and doing away with being selfish. It is a virtue that helps us to use our bodies to express love in purity and truthfulness. Chastity helps us remember who and what we are. Such a great virtue, such a great way to live, and God willing, the students will benefit forever from this "little" gift. If you are interested in having us visit your classroom, the material for these beads is \$1:00 per set of beads and a small amount of our God given time.

Theology of the Body Retreat

In late March, we presented a half day retreat, based on Theology of the *Body for Teens*, to a group of students from St. Don Bosco Secondary School in Toronto. The presentation took place in Transfiguration Church hall. After the students arrived at the church, we began the session with a short Bible reading and a prayer. We followed this with an activity taken from the ToB for Teens Middle School edition. The purpose of this activity was to demonstrate how our lives are so busy and noisy that it is difficult or impossible to hear God's voice when he speaks to us. We made point that we have to quiet the noise and find stillness every day in order to hear God's voice. Following a presentation of what Theology of the Body is, we watched a short introduction on the topic. The second part of the day was based on dating with purity. The activity that started this section demonstrated that the opinions we derive from our culture aren't necessarily the truth and that there is only one truth. Truth is not based upon our own preferences and ideas, but upon the Word of God. Following a discussion on dating, we watched a short video presentation on the topic. The morning wrapped up with a prayer and a pizza lunch.

Dating and Dressing with Dignity

After completing the program, Theology of the Body for Teens, Middle School Edition, for the youth group at St. Bernadette Church, the GSML Ministry prepared a presentation that combined information on dating and on modesty in dressing. For the age group, (grades 6 to 8) we presented dating as an activity that is more proper much to older teens and young adults. Middle school students and high school students would be better getting together in groups and developing their friendships. We made the suggestion that they should pray for their future spouse. When dating does occur, the purpose is to find someone who would make a good mate. We told them that when dating someone, if you can't see yourself marrying that person, then there is no point in continuing that relationship.

In our presentation on dressing with dignity, we emphasized that the way we dress projects ourselves to the world. When others look at us, their eyes can focus on only one place at a time. We should dress so that we draw attention to our faces and not to other body parts. That way, we are seen as persons, not as body parts. We offered tips for taking today's available fashions and accompanying them with layers, scarfs and t-shirts in order to allow ourselves to dress modestly. We ended with a comment by Colleen Hammond, author of Dressing with Dignity, "If we don't treat ourselves with respect by dressing modestly, how can we expect others to

God, for his own desires, created man as being worth much

"Man becomes the image of God not so much in the moment of solitude as in the

Genesis 1 shows us man's worth based on his relationship to God, (and indirectly to all things spiritual), while Genesis 2 shows us how he lived and experienced that worth as a human being. Genesis also seems to tell

more than the rest of creation, but he also created man with a particular worth for mankind itself. "But man was also created as a particular value for himself—first, because he is man; second, because the woman is for the man, and

Right "from the beginning," he is not only an image in which the solitude of a person who rules the world is reflected, but also, and essentially, an image of an inscrutable divine communion of persons." – JP II us that man's first words after the creation of women - "This one at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh! She is to be called Woman, because she was taken from Man." – seem to tell us that the male's emotions at seeing the humanity of the woman as well as the femininity, is something unique and unrepeatable.

In this way, man's original unity, through masculinity and femininity overcomes solitude, and through the attraction of masculinity and femininity we arrive at what the Pope calls the "communion of persons". Solitude leads to unity.

In original solitude man learned personal knowledge of who he was in relationship to the rest of creation. At the same time, still in solitude, he learned that he opened himself up to a being like himself - "a helper fit for him". He leans that he is above the rest of creation, and that he can also have a relationship with another person. Community and communion in this case are not the same. Communion here is used in the true sense of "help". It shows that the person exists for himself as well as for the other person. This communion can only happen in "double solitude". The solitude of humans distinct from the rest of creation, and the solitude of each of them in their male and femaleness,

Genesis 1 tells us that man was created in the image of God as male and female. Chapter 2 does not, but it reveals to us that the overall creation of "man" is expressed in giving life to the "communion of persons". In this way, both texts are in agreement. God himself is a communion of persons in the Trinity, and in this way "man" is in the image of God. Because of this unity or "communion of persons", and through male and femaleness, fertility and human procreation was with us right from the beginning. "Go forth and multiply".

This brings us closer to the physical reality of the body. Through the body, the male was able to identify and name what made them visible to each other, and what identifies their humanity, and he called it "body". Through the words "flesh of my flesh" Adam gave it the exact meaning – that the body reveals man. Since that makes the body truly human, man therefore, even in his physical body, is similar to God.

Right from the beginning the study of the body in the context of God, ties the body into the creation of man in God's image.

Unity, when looked at through the body, has several dimensions. One is moral, as Christ showed us when he talked of divorce to the Pharisees. The other is sacramental, and theological aspect where, through the physical body and through the spirituality of male and femaleness, fertility and human procreation (communion of persons) existed from the beginning.

Masculinity and femininity show the physicality of man as well as a new understanding of that physicality which is a sense of mutual enrichment. This understanding goes much deeper than the mere physical aspect of the body, it is a deeper understanding of both the physicality and the



Billings Ovulation Method


When a woman learns the Billings Ovulation Method, she is taught to recognise and understand her signs of fertility and infertility. She does this by observing the presence or absence of mucus at the vulva. This mucus, produced at the cervix, is essential for fertility. Sperm cells depend on this mucus for their survival and their ability to reach and fertilize the egg.

Mucus that has fertile characteristics indicates the approach of ovulation. Some women experience very little mucus and not in every cycle.

A couple having difficulty in conceiving can be assisted by a Billings Ovulation Method teacher. The teacher can assist the couple to understand the subtle changes in the mucus secretion or sensation, alerting them to the most fertile time in the cycle.

If there are no psychological or medical conditions preventing pregnancy, advice about timing of intercourse to coincide with this mucus provides the greatest success.

The Ovarian Hormone Meter monitors the hormonal ovulatory pattern and has proved useful for those women who have only a slight mucus symptom. Access to the Ovarian Hormone Meter is available through
